


Milford Community House Wall

The pro bono project will restore the Milford Community House in Milford, Pennsylvania. The modest building was first built as a private residence for the Pinchot family in 1824. The New York City Architecture firm of Heins & LaFarge remodeled it in the late 19th century as the family prospered and donated and converted the building to the library for the Yale School of Forestry, and ultimately, the Pike County Public Library. Entering a new phase of its long life, this is an exterior restoration and architectural study updating the measured Historical American Buildings Survey (HABS) drawings, and preparing it for its next life as a center feature of community life.
